The Bulletin also regularly includes a sample of decisions recently published in the AAT's Migration & Refugee Division and Social Services & Child Support Division. It occasionally includes information on legislative changes that affect the AAT.

Compensation

<u>Haskins and Comcare</u> (Compensation) [2017] AATA 8 (10 January 2017); Dr J Popple, Senior Member

Commonwealth employees – Applicant suffered psychological condition as result of counselling session – whether counselling session was reasonable administrative action taken in a reasonable manner in respect of the Applicant's employment – decision under review affirmed

Walker and Military Rehabilitation and Compensation Commission (Compensation) [2017] AATA 9 (9 January 2017); Senior Member J Sosso

Entitlements – whether Commission must accept liability – claimed conditions head/spinal injury – post traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) whether Applicant suffers from claimed conditions – where it is uncertain when claimed conditions commenced – where little evidence of triggering event decision under review affirmed

WFLT and Military Rehabilitation and Compensation Commission (Compensation) [2016] AATA 1072 (22 December 2016); Miss EA Shanahan, Member

Normal weekly earnings – Special Forces Disability Allowance – physical and mental injury sustained in the war in Afghanistan – desire to remain in special forces regiment until retirement age – unfit for active service – transfer to a division with no entitlement to SFDA – discharged on medical grounds – remains incapacitated – decision set aside

Immigration and Citizenship

<u>LQVM and Minister for Immigration and Border Protection</u> (Migration) [2017] AATA 7 (9 January 2017); Ms R Perton, Member

Refusal of protection visa – character test – substantial criminal record – discretion to refuse visa enlivened – drug cultivation and trafficking offences – protection of Australian community – risk to the Australian community should the conduct be repeated – whether risk of future harm acceptable – best interests of minor grand–daughter in Australia – international non–refoulement obligations – decision under review set aside

Oswald and Minister for Immigration and Border Protection (Migration) [2017] AATA 6 (12 January 2017); Dr C Kendall, Deputy President

Mandatory cancellation of applicant's visa – applicant has substantial criminal record and does not pass the character test – whether discretion to revoke mandatory cancellation should be exercised – primary and other relevant considerations considered – decision under review affirmed

Jurisdiction to review decision to cancel registration as migration agent – whether Tribunal has power to make declaration of invalidity – whether applicant denied procedural fairness – onus of proof in administrative proceedings

IMMIGRATION AND CITIZENSHIP – migration agent – cancellation of registration – whether applicant not a person of integrity or otherwise not a fit and proper person to give immigration assistance decision – whether applicant had not complied with the Code of Conduct – immigration assistance – decision under review affirmed

Ristic and Secretary, Department of Social Services (Social services second review) [2017] AATA 2 (11 January 2017); Brigadier AG Warner, Member

Reinstatement of application – whether original application dismissed in error – whether circumstances warrant exercise of discretion – Tribunal has no power to reinstate application – application for reinstatement of application refused

Social Security

<u>Curtis and Secretary, Department of Social Services</u> (Social services second review) [2017] AATA 14 (12 January 2017); Senior Member AC Cotter

Disability support pension – requirement that the person's impairment is of 20 points or more under the Impairment Tables not met – person has not actively participated in a program of support – requirement that the person has a continuing inability to work not met – decision under review affirmed

Henein and Secretary, Department of Social Services (Social services second review) [2017] AATA 10 (5 January 2017); Ms R Perton, Member

Disability support pension – whether medical conditions fully diagnosed, treated and stabilised at time of claim or within 13 weeks of that date – points to be allocated – some conditions not fully diagnosed, treated and stabilized – insufficient points to qualify for disability support pension – resident for less than 10 years – whether medical conditions arose before or after migration – decision affirmed

Jones and Secretary, Department of Social Services (Social services second review) [2017] AATA 4 (6 January 2017); Deputy President K Bean and Senior Member P Britten–Jones

Disability support pension – Whether applicant actively participated in a program of support – Applicant enrolled in program but was exempted by a medical certificate – Consideration of Social Security (Requirements and Guidelines – Active Participation for Disability Support Pension) Determination 2011 – Whether requirements for active participation in subs 5(1) are satisfied – Decision under review affirmed

<u>Kazzi and Secretary, Department of Social Services</u> (Social services second review) [2017] AATA 3 (6 January 2017); Mrs JC Kelly, Senior Member

Disability support pension – multiple conditions – whether applicant's conditions were fully diagnosed, treated and stabilised – whether applicant's impairments are rated 20 points or more under the Impairment Tables – spinal condition awarded 10 points under Table 4 – decision affirmed

<u>Lemon and Secretary, Department of Social Services</u> (Social services second review) [2017] AATA 11 (4 January 2017); Member I Thompson

Disability support pension – whether applicant's medical conditions were fully diagnosed, fully treated and fully stabilised during the assessment period – whether the applicant has a severe impairment – decision under review affirmed

Morgan and Secretary, Department of Social Services (Social services second review) [2017] AATA 15 (11 January 2017); Member DK Grigg

Disability support pension – whether 20 points or more under the impairment tables during the relevant period – whether program of support completed – whether continuing inability to work – decision under review affirmed.

<u>Murphy and Secretary, Department of Social Services</u> (Social services second review) [2017] AATA 16 (13 January 2017); Member DK Grigg

Austudy allowance – overpayment – where applicant did not notify of change of circumstances – where no administrative error – where no special circumstances – decision under review affirmed

<u>Pikoulas and Secretary, Department of Social Services</u> (Social services second review) [2017] AATA 12 (10 January 2017); Ms N Isenberg, Senior Member

Age pension – Dutch pension as income – estopped from reconsidering whether Dutch pension is income – intention to use proceeds of sale from former principal home towards a new principal home – homeowner – financial assets – decision set aside and remitted

<u>Smolski and Secretary, Department of Social Services</u> (Social services second review) [2017] AATA 13 (4 January 2017); Mr DJ Morris, Member

Disability Support Pension (DSP) – whether qualified – whether impairments fully diagnosed, fully treated and fully stabilised – whether impairments attract 20 points or more on Impairment Tables – not qualified for DSP – decision affirmed

<u>Triantafillou and Secretary, Department of Social Services</u> (Social services second review) [2017] AATA 5 (12 January 2017); Brigadier AG Warner, Member

Disability support pension – whether applicant's impairments were fully diagnosed, treated and stabilised – whether applicant's impairments attract 20 points under Impairment Tables – decision under review affirmed

Veterans' Affairs

<u>Scott and Repatriation Commission</u> (Veterans' entitlements) [2017] AATA 1 (11 January 2017); Brigadier AG Warner, Member

War widow's pension – operational service – whether death war–caused – Statement of Principles No. 75 of 2012 as amended by Amendment Instrument No. 37 of 2016, concerning acute lymphoblastic leukaemia – factor 6(b), being exposed to benzene as specified – whether reasonable hypothesis connecting death to service – material found not to raise reasonable hypothesis – veteran's death not war–caused – decision affirmed

<u>Sheridan and Repatriation Commission</u> (Veterans' entitlements) [2017] AATA 17 (12 January 2017); Dr D Cremean, Senior Member

Claim for diabetes mellitus (type 2) – accepted condition of lumbar spondylosis – whether such condition caused the Applicant's obesity – whether diabetes caused by lumbar spondylosis – no connection – decision affirmed
