### **AAT Recent Decisions**

#### **Migration**

<u>CBYQ and Minister for Immigration and Border Protection</u> (Migration) [2018] AATA 91 (31 January 2018); Deputy President JW Constance and Senior Member C Puplick AM

MIGRATION – visa – refusal – character test – consideration of past and present criminal conduct – consideration of past and present general conduct – whether there is a risk the Applicant would engage in criminal conduct if allowed to remain in Australia – offences – unlawful assault – breaches of Family Violence Order – unlawfully residing in Australia and two other countries – must consider all relevant circumstances of the particular case – no more than minimal or remote risk of engaging in criminal conduct – Applicant passes the character test – consideration of whether the discretion to refuse to grant the visa should be exercised – protection of Australian community – no more than a minimal or remote risk of re-offending – expectations of Australian community – genuine fears for life and physical safety if returned to country of birth – international non-refoulement obligations owed – decision set aside and remitted for reconsideration

BANKRUPTCY – PRACTICE AND PROCEDURE – directions hearing – request for reasons – no direction made – matter adjourned to allow discussions – explanation given but no obligation to give reasons for a decision made on a procedural step in the proceedings that does not resolve an issue.

<u>Western Institute of Technology Pty Ltd and Australian Skills Quality Authority</u> [2018] AATA 94 (25 January 2018); Senior Member DJ Morris

PRACTICE AND PROCEDURE – application to vary stay order provisions – Tribunal's discretion wide – principles to take into account – principles of Acts under which original decision made relevant – hearing not considering substantive review of original decision – steps towards compliance relevant to substantive review – application to vary stay order refused

#### **Professions and Trades**

Peterson and Tax Practitioners Board [2018] AATA 93 (31 January 2018); Deputy President SA Forgie

TAX AGENT - registration - whether breaches of code of professional conduct - decision affirmed

#### **Social Security**

Hawkins and Secretary, Department of Social Services (Social services second review) [2018] AATA 108 (1 February 2018); Senior Member B Stefaniak AM RFD

SOCIAL SECURITY – carer payment – whether Applicant provides constant care – whether Applicant provides constant care in a private residence that is the home of the care receiver – Applicant 'on-call' – reviewable decision set aside.

Hughson and Secretary, Department of Social Services (Social services second review) [2018] AATA 89 (30 January 2018); Ms A Wood, Member

SOCIAL SECURITY – disability support pension – impairment - whether disability is fully treated and fully stabilised – application fails – decision affirmed

<u>Kirwan and Secretary, Department of Health</u> (Social services second review) [2018] AATA 109 (31 January 2018); Deputy President J Sosso

HEALTH – aged care – assessment of value of Applicant's assets – were the premises the Applicant's principal home – close relation – whether premises occupied for past five years – whether close relation had life interest in the premises – decision under review affirmed

#### **Veterans' Affairs**

<u>Manwaring and Repatriation Commission</u> (Veterans' entitlements) [2018] AATA 88 (30 January 2018); Deputy President J Sosso

VETERANS AFFAIRS – war widow's pension – whether death of veteran was war caused – prostate cancer – claim that veteran's service led to change in diet and to continuing high animal fat intake – relevant service – no evidence linking increased intake to operational service – decision under review affirmed
