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AAT Recent Decisions

This section of the Bulletin provides information about all decisions recently published in the AAT's General, Freedom of Information, National Disability Insurance Scheme, Security, Taxation & Commercial and Veterans' Appeals. This list also includes selected child support decisions published by the Social Services & Child Support Division and examples of recent decisions published by the Migration & Refugee Division. Compensation

Abraham and Comcare (Compensation) [2018] AATA 177 (15 February 2018); Senior Member A Poljak

COMPENSATION – workers compensation – section 16 claim – lower back pain – whether applicant made wilful and false representation – medical and claim history not disclosed – disease not taken to be an injury – decision affirmed

Beasley and Military Rehabilitation and Compensation Commission (Compensation) [2018] AATA 167 (9 February 2018); Deputy President K Bean

COMPENSATION – Commonwealth employees – Liability accepted for digital nerve neuroma 3/4 metatarsal space, left foot, resulting in metatarsalgia – Further claims for compensation lodged in respect of other conditions for which compensation liability denied – Whether claims precluded as outside timeframe contemplated by applicable legislation – Lengthy delay of some 46 years between suffering injuries and making the claims – Decisions under review affirmed.

<u>Kruljac and Australian Postal Corporation</u> (Compensation) [2018] AATA 171 (9 February 2018); Miss EA Shanahan, Member

WORKERS' COMPENSATION – multiple claims over 20 years – multiple injuries sustained in the course of work – past acceptance of liability in relation to shoulder and cervical spine dysfunction – current claims relate to left shoulder, aggravation of cervical spondylosis, secondary psychological state and s 16 claims relating to treatment and medication – failure to undertake rehabilitation return to work program – suspension of rights under s 37(7) of the SRC Act – later remitted for reconsideration.

<u>Squires and Comcare</u> (Compensation) [2018] AATA 166 (12 February 2018); Senior Member A Poliak

COMPENSATION – workers compensation – section 14 claim – psychological condition – aggravation of an ailment – whether employment contributed to a material or significant degree — abusive and threatening telephone calls – management issues – lack of contemporaneous evidence – pre-existing vulnerability – decision affirmed

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Migration

Anyoun and Minister for Immigration and Border Protection (Migration) [2018] AATA 174 (14 February 2018); Senior Member DJ Morris

MIGRATION – request for revocation of mandatory cancellation of applicant's visa – applicant has substantial criminal record and does not pass character test – whether discretion to revoke the mandatory cancellation should be exercised – procedural issue – admission of a late document - primary considerations – protection of the Australian community from criminal or other serious conduct – best interests of minor children in Australia – expectations of the Australian community – other considerations – non-refoulement obligations – strength, nature and duration of ties – extent of impediments if removed – decision under review affirmed

<u>Furlong and Minister for Immigration and Border Protection</u> (Migration) [2017] AATA 3014 (21 December 2017); Senior Member Britten-Jones

MIGRATION – visa refusal – skilled-nominated visa – whether person passes the character test – consideration of "criminal" conduct at lower end of the spectrum – whether there is a risk of engaging in criminal conduct - whether discretion to refuse to grant a visa should be exercised – protection of the Australian community from criminal and other serious conduct – primary and other considerations under Ministerial Direction No. 65 – decision under review is set aside.

Qiao and Minister for Immigration and Border Protection (Migration) [2018] AATA 168 (23 January 2018); Mrs JC Kelly, Senior Member

MIGRATION – visa refusal – student visa – failure to pass the character test – substantial criminal record – term of imprisonment of 12 months or more – protection of the Australian community – nature and seriousness of conduct – risk to the Australian community – expectations of the Australian community – other considerations – decision affirmed

Social Security

<u>Housego and Secretary, Department of Social Services</u> (Social services second review) [2018] AATA 172 (13 February 2018); Member G Hallwood

SOCIAL SECURITY - pensions, benefits and allowances - Newstart allowance - whether Newstart allowance correctly cancelled - decision under review affirmed

<u>Joneidi and Secretary, Department of Social Services</u> (Social services second review) [2018] AATA 176 (14 February 2018); Dr L Bygrave, Member

SOCIAL SECURITY – disability support pension – impairment – whether disability is fully diagnosed, treated and fully stabilised – whether applicant's impairments attract 20 points or more under the Impairment Tables – depression – bilateral knees osteoarthritis – spinal and neck condition – other conditions – decision under review affirmed

<u>Stavrinidis and Secretary, Department of Social Services</u> (Social services second review) [2018] AATA 169 (12 February 2018); Dr D Cremean, Senior Member and Ms A Wood, Member

SOCIAL SECURITY – Age Pension– reduction in rate — whether disposal of asset within meaning of s 1123 Social Security Act 1991 – income and assets test – acquisition of joint interest in new property—whether gift or not—consideration—constructive trust – whether diminished value of all assets – decision set aside and remitted

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Taxation

<u>Coventry and Commissioner of Taxation</u> (Taxation) [2018] AATA 175 (12 January 2018); Ms G Lazanas, Senior Member

TAXATION AND REVENUE – income tax – foreign earnings derived from foreign service – tax exemption lost if earnings exempt from income tax in foreign country only because of any of certain specified reasons – whether taxpayer satisfies definition of Australian project personnel in agreement – objection decision set aside and substituted

MedAid Pty Ltd and Commissioner of Taxation (Taxation) [2018] AATA 170 (12 February 2018); Deputy President BJ McCabe

TAXPAYER COMPANY DEREGISTERED – joinder application to continue proceedings – person whose interests are affected – interests as a creditor – indirect interests in a company – power to determine where interests affected

Veterans' Affairs

<u>Sharpe and Repatriation Commission</u> (Veterans' entitlements) [2018] AATA 173 (14 February 2018); Senior Member A Nikolic AM CSC

VETERANS' AFFAIRS – war widow's pension – operational service – whether veteran's death was war-caused – Statement of Principles concerning Malignant Neoplasm of the Prostate – whether Prostate Cancer caused by increased consumption of animal fat during service – whether reasonable hypothesis connecting death of veteran with service – cause of death dementia – material found not to raise reasonable hypothesis – veteran's death not war-caused – decision under review affirmed
