Applicant approved for conferral of Australian citizenship – applicant overseas caring for person critically ill – cancellation of approval when applicant failed to make a pledge of commitment within 12 months after date of approval – decision under review affirmed

Application for Australian Citizenship – application refused on character grounds – criminal record – whether applicant has reformed and is now of good character – decision under review set aside and remitted

Independent school – funding provided by Commonwealth – where Minister revoked approval of Applicant as an approved authority under the Australian Education Act 2013 – where Applicant sought stay of decision – whether Tribunal has jurisdiction to grant a stay – whether the Tribunal should use its discretion to grant a stay – stay granted

Regulation of migration agents – Fit and proper person to provide immigration assistance – whether breaches of code of conduct – whether penalty excessive – decision under review affirmed

Review of respondent's decision to cancel applicant's registration as migration agent – whether applicant knew application for registration was false or misleading in a material particular – whether applicant is not a person of integrity or otherwise not a fit and proper person to provide immigration assistance – whether applicant failed to comply with the Migration Agents' Code of Conduct – decision affirmed

Age pension – details of income stream – non-disclosure of income from superannuation fund – age pension debt – whether debt due solely to an administrative error made by the Commonwealth – whether special circumstances – decision affirmed

Pensions, benefits, allowances – application for disability support pension – nominated conditions of back, neck, knee pain and depression – lack of objective evidence – all conditions are not fully diagnosed, treated and stabilised – no impairment rating attracted – decision affirmed
