Whether applicant suffered an injury in 2009 – psychological condition – whether events in 2009 aggravated a previous injury – decision under review affirmed

Psychiatric injury – Whether injury is the result of reasonable administrative action taken in a reasonable manner – Reasonableness to be assessed with reference to the circumstances surrounding the action

Immigration and Citizenship

Wang and Minister for Immigration and Border Protection [2014] AATA 555; 8/8/2014; Senior Member CR Walsh

Eligibility – citizenship by conferral – general residence requirement – non-citizen Applicant spouse of Australian citizen – non-citizen Applicant had periods of absence from Australia in four years immediately before citizenship application – non-citizen Applicant accompanied Australian citizen husband overseas for his employment – discretion to treat periods of absence from Australia as ones in which non-citizen Applicant was "present in Australia as a permanent resident" – whether non-citizen Applicant had "close and continuing association with Australia" during periods of absence from Australia in four years immediately before citizenship application – decision under review affirmed

Extension of time – application for review lodged outside prescribed period – unsatisfactory explanation for delay – applicant rested on rights – apparent lack of merit of application for review – Tribunal not satisfied that reasonable in all the circumstances to grant extension of time – application for extension of time refused

Extension of time – application for extension of time refused

Balsara and Secretary, Department of Social Services [2014] AATA 562; 13/8/2014; Miss EA Shanahan, Member

Disability support pension – no impairment rating possible – multiple medical conditions none of which are fully treated and stabilised – decision affirmed

<u>Lukin and Secretary, Department of Social Services</u> [2014] AATA 563; 14/8/2014; Senior Member RW Dunne, Professor P Reilly, Member

Pensions, benefits and allowances – claim for disability support pension rejected – physical, intellectual or psychiatric impairment – whether impairment rating of 20 points or more existed under the Impairment Tables – whether there was a "continuing inability to work" – reports of medical practitioners and psychiatrist considered – Job Capacity Assessments conducted – decision under review affirmed

<u>Swale; Secretary, Department of Social Services and</u> [2014] AATA 554; 1/8/2014; Senior Member AF Cunningham

Claim for Parenting Payment (Partnered) – whether Assessable Income exceeds the Personal Income Cut-Off Limit – whether Trust Income should be included – whether Applicant is an Attributable Stakeholder of the Trust – whether Trust Distributions were made in accordance with Validly Executed Resolutions under the Trust Deed – decision under review set aside

<u>Tralongo and Secretary, Department of Social Services</u> [2014] AATA 560; 31/7/2014; Senior Member RW Dunne

Pensions, benefits and allowances – claim for fares allowance – journey using reasonable route at least expensive form of public transport that is reasonable – no discretion – decision under review affirmed

<u>Von Zum Hof and Secretary, Department of Social Services</u> [2014] AATA 556; 5/6/2014; Senior Member J Toohey

AUSTUDY – whether applicant overpaid – whether special circumstances – decision that applicant has a debt affirmed – amount of debt varied on account of special circumstances

Wells and Secretary, Department of Social Services [2014] AATA 549; 28/7/2014; Ms R Perton, Member

Newstart allowance – unemployment arising from a voluntary act or misconduct as an employee – eight week period of non-payment – limited discretion to waive eight week period – decision affirmed

<u>Wroblewska-Drag and Secretary, Department of Social Services</u> [2014] AATA 559; 26/5/2014; Senior Member AF Cunningham

Portability of payments – cancellation of benefits whilst applicant was overseas for more than 6 weeks – decision under review affirmed

Veterans' Affairs

Hart and Repatriation Commission [2014] AATA 564; 14/8/2014; Senior Member J Handley

Applicant served with the Royal Australian Navy – three periods of operational service – increase in smoking prior to operational service – whether attributable to fear of entering a war zone or the disappointment of not being permitted to pursue preferred career path – whether carotid artery disease, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease and cerebrovascular accident war-caused – decision set aside – assessment remitted

Hind and Repatriation Commission [2014] AATA 565; 15/8/2014; Senior Member RG Kenny

Disability pension – Defence service with Royal Australian Air Force – Malignant neoplasm of the bladder – Condition related to smoking cigarettes – Statement of Principles for malignant neoplasm of the bladder – Smoking not related to defence service – Condition not defence caused – Decision affirmed

<u>Howes and Repatriation Commission</u> [2014] AATA 568; 15/8/2014; Dr P McDermott RFD, Senior Member

Applicant served in Royal Australian Air Force – Applicant suffers from adjustment disorder – Whether adjustment disorder is defence-caused – Insufficient evidence to conclude applicant suffers from adjustment disorder – Whether applicant suffered category 2 stressor within the 3 months before clinical onset – No evidence of date of clinical onset provided – Decision under review affirmed
