Recent developments

This section of the Bulletin contains information about recent legal changes that affect the AAT or other important developments.

Revised Guide to the Workers' Compensation Jurisdiction and New Practice Directions

The AAT is introducing some changes to practice and procedure to promote effective case management and the timely progress of applications for review of Commonwealth workers' compensation decisions.

The AAT is taking steps to clarify its expectations as to how applications will progress in this jurisdiction. In particular, the Tribunal will issue a notice at the commencement of each review setting out how the review will proceed, including what parties are expected to do prior to the first conference to ensure it is as effective as possible. The notice will also give an indication of the months by which the Tribunal will aim to hold any conciliation or hearing in order to try to finalise the application within 12 months of lodgement.

The AAT has also issued two new practice directions.

- The Practice Direction relating to the Use of Video Surveillance Material sets out when parties will usually be required to lodge and exchange such material in proceedings in the Tribunal. The general requirement to disclose video surveillance material on which a party intends to rely in advance of a hearing will apply to applications in which a hearing is listed to commence on or after 28 October 2013.
- The Practice Direction relating to Release from the Implied Undertaking sets out
 when a party will be required to make a request for release from the undertaking
 that a party may not use a document provided under compulsion in an AAT
 proceeding for any purpose other than the purpose for which it was given. It
 also sets out how such requests should be made.

The Tribunal has issued a revised version of its Guide to the Workers' Compensation Jurisdiction which sets out how the Tribunal manages applications for review in the workers' compensation jurisdiction. It incorporates references to the changes referred to above and has otherwise been updated to reflect current practices.
