Right upper limb injury – previously accepted condition – whether liability has ceased – whether compensation payable for two periods in 2012 – whether 2013 right wrist/arm injury significantly contributed to by employment – decision set aside

Classification of goods – composite goods made up of different components – determination of essential character – application of Interpretation Rules – *Customs Tariff Act 1995* (Cth) – decision affirmed

SOCIAL SECURITY – application dismissed as frivolous or vexatious and applicant directed not to make any further application without leave of the Tribunal – direction limited to applications to Tribunal – whether direction should be discharged or varied – Tribunal decides not to discharge or vary direction

## Social Security

<u>Casey and Secretary, Department of Social Services</u> [2014] AATA 690; 22/9/2014; Senior Member G Ettinger

Overpayment of pension – Applicant did not disclose purchase of land in Queensland to the Respondent – Applicant claims he bought it for his son – he did not tell his son about it – Tribunal finds that the Applicant has used the names Patrick Peter Casey and Peter Patrick Casey interchangeably for most of his life – decision under review affirmed.

Pensions – disability support pension – whether applicant's conditions were fully diagnosed, treated and stabilised – whether applicant's impairment is rated 20 points or more under the Impairment Tables – whether applicant had a continuing inability to work – decision set aside

Disability support pension – portability period – discretionary power to determine portability period – decision affirmed

Relief from taxation debt – serious hardship – whether there is serious hardship – if there is serious hardship whether discretion to release ought be exercised – decision affirmed

## **Veterans' Affairs**

<u>Fielden and Repatriation Commission</u> [2014] AATA 702; 25/9/2014; Brigadier C Ermert (Retd), Member

Veteran not yet turned 65 – totally and permanently incapacitated – incapacity from war-caused injury or war-caused disease alone – prevented from continuing to undertake remunerative work – decision set aside
