Reservist work – Injury sustained during full time employment – Relevant weekly earnings that of the latest 2 weeks of continuous full time employment – Earnings or potential earnings of reservist work not included in compensation – Decision under review affirmed

Whether injury result of earlier claim – Whether condition caused or aggravated through employment – Whether employment contributed to a significant degree – Whether condition permanent – Decision under review affirmed
