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

QUESTION NUMBER: 4001

Kim Carr asked the following question, upon notice, on 13 August 2021.

With respect to the Administrative Appeals Tribunal and the processing of Freedom of Information requests:

1. Since July 2018, has the Tribunal at all times complied with its legal obligations under section 11C of the Freedom of Information Act; if not, how many times has it breached section 11C and why has it failed to comply with its legal obligations.

2. In 2018-19, did the Tribunal ever breach its legal obligation under section 11C of the Freedom of Information Act to publish a relevant document (being a document to which section 11C applies) on a website within 10 working days of a person being given access to that document; if so, how many times did the Tribunal breach its legal obligation under section 11C in 2018-19.

3. In 2019-20, did the Tribunal ever breach its legal obligation under section 11C of the Freedom of Information Act to publish a relevant document (being a document to which section 11C applies) on a website within 10 working days of a person being given access to that document; if so, how many times did the Tribunal breach its legal obligation under section 11C in 2019-20.

4. In 2020-21, did the Tribunal ever breach its legal obligation under section 11C of the Freedom of Information Act to publish a relevant document (being a document to which section 11C applies) on a website within 10 working days of a person being given access to that document; if so, how many times did the Tribunal breach its legal obligation under section 11C in 2020-21.

5. On the date that the Tribunal received this question, was the Tribunal in breach of its legal obligation under section 11C of the Freedom of Information Act to publish a relevant document (being a document to which section 11C applies) on a website within 10 working days of a person being given access to that document; if so, as at the date the Tribunal received this question, how many documents had the Tribunal failed to publish on a website in accordance with section 11C.

Senator the Hon Michaelia Cash has provided the following answer to the senator's question:

^1. The Administrative Appeals Tribunal does not administer the *Freedom of Information Act 1982*. It follows that it is not a matter for the Administrative Appeals Tribunal to determine whether or not its own actions conform with the requirements of that Act or otherwise. The following information is provided for your assistance.

The Administrative Appeals Tribunal has a disclosure log pursuant to section 11C of the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* on its website:

FOI disclosure log | Administrative Appeals Tribunal (aat.gov.au)

The function of the Administrative Appeals Tribunal is the conduct of merits review of administrative decisions. The vast majority of applicants for review are individuals seeking review of decisions that affect them or their business affairs, personally. The vast majority of the information held by the Administrative Appeals Tribunal concerns these applications and the vast majority of requests received by the Administrative Appeals Tribunal under the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* concern this information.

Section 11C of the Freedom of Information Act 1982, relevantly, provides:

- (1) This section applies to information if an agency or Minister gives a person access to a document under section 11A containing the information, except in the case of any of the following:
 - (a) personal information about any person, if it would be unreasonable to publish the information;
 - (b) information about the business, commercial, financial or professional affairs of any person, if it would be unreasonable to publish the information;
 - (c) other information of a kind determined by the Information Commissioner under subsection (2), if it would be unreasonable to publish the information;
 - (d) any information, if it is not reasonably practicable to publish the information under this section because of the extent of any modifications to a document (or documents) necessary to delete information mentioned in paragraphs (a) to (c).

It follows that the vast majority of information released by the Administrative Appeals Tribunal in response to freedom of information requests is not required to be published on the disclosure log because it does not fall within the scope of section 11C. Similarly, information released by the Administrative Appeals Tribunal under its administrative access arrangements is not within scope of section 11C. Note also the date on which access is given to documents for the purposes of section 11C(6) is not necessarily the date on which a decision is made where third parties have a right of review under the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* or where particular arrangements are made with the person making the request.

2. I refer to the answer given to question 1. In 2018-19 the Administrative Appeals Tribunal received 1,529 freedom of information requests and staff spent 7 hours on the Information Publication Scheme tasks.

3. I refer to the answer given to question 1. In 2019-20 the Administrative Appeals Tribunal received 1,564 freedom of information requests and staff spent 17 hours on Information Publication Scheme tasks. In early 2020 the Administrative Appeals Tribunal decided to review the entries on the disclosure due to many entries being out of date. There is no requirement in relation to the duration of posting. In addition, an improved design was sought. This task was not complete when COVID 19 restrictions commenced that required staff to change work practices in order to maintain freedom of information services the public and particularly applicants requiring documents from their case files for the purposes of reviews or appeals.

While the Administrative Appeals Tribunal bought forward digitalisation strategies, necessarily current review services were prioritised to ensure continuity of business. Requests under the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* are still made for older documents in physical form, which are not always readily accessible under COVID 19 restrictions. In addition, certain technology required for the management voluminous requests has not always been accessible to staff during this period, resulting in more staff hours spent on processing requests than in previous years. Considering it more efficient to complete the re-design project before adding to the disclosure log, the posting of 1 item of released material was delayed in this period. The material is now included in the disclosure log.

4. I refer to the answers given to questions 1. In 2020-21 the Administrative Appeals Tribunal received 1,600 freedom of information requests and staff spent 20 hours on Information Publication Scheme tasks. As COVID 19 restrictions continue, for the reasons set out in the answer to question 3, the posting of 8 items of released material was delayed during this period. The material is now included in the disclosure log.

5. I refer to the answers given to questions 1, 3 and 4. On the date the Administrative Appeals Tribunal received this question the disclosure log required updating with the items referred to in the answers to questions 3 and 4 and one further item. This has been done.

Senator the Hon Michaelia Cash has provided the following answer to the senator's question:

1. Section 11C of the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* (FOI Act) requires an agency to publish information to which that section applies on a website, including by making the information available for downloading from the website or by publishing on the website other details of how the information may be obtained. The Administrative Appeals Tribunal (AAT) does not administer the FOI Act. It is not a matter for the AAT to determine whether or not its own actions conform with the requirements of section 11C of that Act. The AAT has identified, however, that since July 2018 there have been 21 requests for access to documents in relation to which the AAT included information on the FOI disclosure log on its website more than 10 working days after giving a person access to documents. The AAT's processes for publishing

information within the timeframe were not implemented in a timely manner. The AAT has advised that it will review and improve its processes to ensure information is published within the timeframe.

- 2. In 2018–19, there were 8 requests for access to documents in relation to which the AAT included information on the FOI disclosure log more than 10 working days after giving a person access to the documents.
- 3. In 2019–20, there were 2 requests for access to documents in relation to which the AAT included information on the FOI disclosure log more than 10 working days after giving a person access to the documents.
- 4. In 2020–21, there were 10 requests for access to documents in relation to which the AAT included information on the FOI disclosure log more than 10 working days after giving a person access to the documents.
- 5. On 13 August 2021, the date the AAT received this question, there were 12 requests for access to documents in relation to which the AAT had not included information on the FOI disclosure log within 10 working days after giving a person access to the documents. Information in relation to those requests has subsequently been included on the AAT's FOI disclosure log.
